

Foreword by Príncípal Kevín Elgood

2015 marks the 60th Anniversary for East Hills Boys High School, 60 years of outstanding boys education and certainly a milestone worthy of celebration. As the 10th principal appointed to East Hills Boys High School, It is with pleasure that I introduce this magazine which provides a snapshot of life at East Hills Boys High School over the past 60 years.

Last year, we were fortunate to have the opportunity to meet some of our inaugural 1955 students who provided us with very interesting information about our history and life at East Hills Boys at the time. Mr Roger Juchau, who initiated the visit, said that his class started in 1955 in temporary accommodation at Canterbury Junior High School. The school moved to Panania in third term 1955 when the construction of the new buildings had reached a stage that was sufficient to accommodate the new East Hills Boys High School students. Since that time East Hills Boys has educated many thousands of very successful young men and earned a reputation as the leading boys high school in South West Sydney.

The school has evolved over the years with the addition of new buildings to cater for changing enrolment and educational demands. The latest upgrade was completed in 2012 when over \$8 million was allocated to provide much needed upgrades across the school, including; a new toilet block, a new library, two new commercial kitchens, a new administration block to replace the outdated A Block, a new canteen in M Block, refurbishment of Blocks B, C, D, E, F, and S and various landscaping works around the grounds. These works provided the school with modern facilities and great new learning spaces.

Our celebrations include an anniversary dinner on Friday 4th December and an open day on Saturday 5th December. The open day will give our current students and staff the opportunity to highlight the school, the variety of cultures represented by our student body and some of the magnificent work that they do in class today. I would like to make special mention of Mrs Karen Savins who has passionately led, driven and coordinated our 60th celebrations. Mrs Savins is our relieving deputy principal and our longest serving member of staff, since Mr Bernie Williams retired last year after 37 years here at East Hills Boys High School.

Our school crest was modernised a decade ago, but our school motto "Servio" (I Serve), still as relevant as it was when introduced by our founding principal, Mr M. S. Cannon. The school has continually adapted to a changing environment for the past 6 decades and retained the strong sense of tradition and school spirit established by our founding students and staff. Our history of success and achievement across all areas has instilled in the students a consciousness of a high standard of achievement and conduct, a respect towards others, a keenness for learning and a pride in belonging to such a great school.

I am sure that students and staff associated with the school will look back on their memories with pride and satisfaction. I look forward to being a part of the next 60 years with great anticipation and the knowledge that the school is well placed as a leader in boys education for future generations.

Enjoy this opportunity to share memories and help us celebrate our first 60 years.
