Principal's Message

I am pleased to report to our community that Term 2 has been an exceptional term at East Hills Boys High School. We have had many highlights across a variety of events and spirits are high among the staff and students at the school.

I would like to applaud our entire school community, staff, students, parents and carers for the significant improvement in student engagement with school. Improved engagement with school has led to a decline in student management issues. This has led to a reduction in risk taking behaviour which often leads to suspension. I'm proud to state that our suspension rate has declined by approximately 50% when compared to data of the last 5 years. Playing a significant role in this data has been the excellent work of Samantha McKenzie (Head Teacher Welfare), Nektar Stefanis (Deputy Principal) and Byron Hackshall (PDHPE Teacher) for their running of our new initiative the Re-Connect Room. Re-Connect serves as a support for students that enables them to reflect on their efforts at school and re-engage with their curriculum.

Other contributing factors include, a concerted effort from the school in 2021 with providing Year 7 with a platform for high school success. Which entails reduced class sizes and an increase in SLSO support for these Year 7 students. It is our belief that if we can provide a stable platform for the Year 7's then we will ensure positive experiences as they progress through high school. All teachers of Year 7 have reported there is a marked difference with the Year 7 students, as they are working well in all classrooms. Of course we are attempting to engage our boys in more meaningful curricula, focusing on developing skills that will support our students with their post school options. Whilst the Auto Shed has been a highlight here as we strive to encourage safe road users of our Year 10 students, we will soon be able to showcase Construction Zone. We are presently in the process of developing an area where our Construction students can work in a place that simulates a regular construction workplace. Thus providing authentic learning opportunities for our students. We are hoping that this space will be operational in Term 4.

Our school sporting teams continue to do well, as do our individual athletes who are representing our school at Zone and Regional level. This is highlighted by the success of the Puma Cup team, who represent our school in football (soccer). Under the guidance of Supercoach Ben Willson the boys have reached the final 16 in the state. Our next game versus Figtree High School will be a tough game, but the team and the coaching staff are confident that they can progress. The game will be in Week 10 so follow our social media accounts to see how the boys go.

"Rosie's" arrival has been exciting for us too this term. "Rosie" is our new 25 seat school bus, and she'll be used to support our staff and students with their excursions and sporting events. Rosie escorted the Puma Cup team to Regional Finals day last week where the boys won their Semi-Final versus Miller Technology High School 7-1 and then the final versus Fairfield High School 7-2. The boys were very appreciative of "Rosie's" support.

The staff have been working hard with students over the past couple of weeks as we have been assessing the learning of Semester 1. All junior reports will be available through the Parent portal on Sentral by the end of term. So please don't forget to access the reports and discuss with your sons the progress they have made this year so far. As always if you are having difficulty accessing the reports on the Parent Portal please contact the school so we can support you.

When we return for Term 3 after our mid-year break on 12 July, we will be well and truly into Winter. Please ensure you are supporting the school by providing your boys with the correct school uniform that is warm and comfortable. For those who are interested in purchasing our new school jackets, we have plenty available. They are \$65 and only available at the school. Please don't forget that these are the new sports jacket. They can be worn every day, not just on sports days. The larger black soft shell jacket is still available at Moorebank Uniforms, which is located on the other side of Panania railway station. For those students and parents, who are thinking of leaving school at the end of 2021, or even now, particularly the boys in Years 10,11 and 12. I would like to recommend The Jobs for Youth Night at Bankstown Sports Club on Tuesday the 22nd June. Booking into the evening and taking your son to this event can be significant movement in his transition from school into the workplace, as many employers at the seminar will be looking to take on apprentices in a variety of fields.

SRC NEWS

On the 26th of May 2021, East Hills Boy's High Schools senior leaders Muhammad Awan and David Thai visited the NSW Parliament house. During this time, they toured around the Legislative Assembly and Legislative Council Chambers whereby they were introduced to the NSW Parliamentary Education Staff, of which, included Wendy Lindsay. Wendy Lindsay is an Australian Politician who has been part of NSW Legislative Assembly since 2018, her primary role is representing East Hills for the liberal party.

After meeting with the politicians of the Legislative Assembly, students were given the opportunity to ask questions, allowing them to gain a general overview of the types of work which must be done in order to meet the demands of the NSW population. Many of the tasks included added ramps in local parks for wheelchairs and organising awareness days for Aboriginals. Shortly afterwards, the students were provided with lunch, consisting of sandwiches and drinks before heading off to the Governor's house.

The Governor, Her Excellency The Honourable Margret Beazley AO QC is the 39th and current Governor of NSW, servicing since 2nd of May 2019. While at the Governor's house, our students were given the opportunity to ask Her Excellency questions relating to her work as well as plans to maintain or enhance the prosperity of the NSW population, mainly consisting of ideas to increase living conditions for rural and remote Australia post bush fires and floods.

The students were then provided with afternoon tea at Her Excellency's house and were welcomed to stay and look around as well as take photos with Her Excellency before departing the Governor's house.

Literacy & numeracy program

Parents – here is your June literacy & numeracy program update:

Year 7:

The Accelerated Reader program is now in full swing, recording each boy's reading record and levels of comprehension demonstrated so far. Some boys have done really well, and should be congratulated for their efforts. Remember: at least 20 minutes of reading per evening is needed on Accelerated Readers!

Year 8:

During subject selection evening, on 16th June, parents will also be given vital information about Minimum Standards (literacy & numeracy) required for the HSC. This information is immensely important, and all parents are advised to make this evening an absolute priority! Writing tasks were also held across the school during Semester 1, and these results will now be analysed to determine those students who need extra support with their writing. Parents, you will be informed if your son is in this group.



Year 7 & 9 students:

<u>NAPLAN on-line tests</u> are now over for the year, and it is expected that results will be available to schools and parents in about August. Many thanks to all parents for supporting their sons through this test period.

Year 10 & 11 students:

All Year 10 and 11 students have now had opportunities to sit for <u>HSC Minimum Standards tests in</u> <u>reading, writing and numeracy.</u> In each case, results have been forwarded to Students Online accounts, to which all students have access via their NESA identification numbers.

For those boys who have been previously unsuccessful in any Minimum Standards tests, further test opportunities and support will be available, each Term. If any parents are uncertain of their sons' Minimum Standards status, or details of further test opportunities and support, they are very welcome to call me at the school.





- Use appropriate language not offensive or racist language
- Fighting, spitting, feet on seats, throwing things in or from the bus is not permitted
- No eating or drinking (other than water) unless for medical reasons or the bus operator gives written permission.
- Offer seats to adults including people with a disability, elderly or expectant mothers
- Do not push or shove other people
- Do not bully or harass other passengers or the driver
- Avoid attracting the attention of the driver except in the case of emergency
- Do not play music at such volume that it may distract the bus driver or other passengers.

Safety on and near buses

- Obey reasonable directions from the driver (e.g. where to sit or to remain in the bus)
- Remain in your seat do not move around the bus unnecessarily
- If standing, remain behind the front passenger seat and keep a secure hand hold at all times
- Keep bags and other items clear of the aisle
- Do not allow any part of your body to protrude out of the bus at any time
- Wait for the bus in a quiet and orderly manner including at bus interchanges
- Stand away from the roadside until the bus comes to a complete stop
- Allow other passengers to leave the bus before stepping onto the bus in a single line
- Wait until the bus stops before moving to get off the bus at your designated stop
- Cross the road where and when it's safe to do so, use crossings/traffic lights where available.

Legal considerations on buses

- Wear the seat belt properly adjusted and fastened, if one is available
- Obey the law that bans smoking on buses
- Ensure that buses are not vandalised report any damage, e.g. graffiti and window etching, to the driver
- Do not interfere with bus property, equipment and signage
- Do not leave rubbish on the bus, or at bus stops or interchanges.

Using bus passes:

- Show travel passes or tickets to the driver on boarding and to Authorised Revenue Protection Officers, NSW
- Police Officers or bus company representative when requested
- Use the travel pass only for its intended purpose do not lend your pass to other students or borrow a pass from them
- Swipe or 'dip' passes in ticket readers if available when boarding
- If issued with a School Opal card, always tap on when boarding and tap off when leaving the bus.

Disobeying these rules may lead to the withdrawal of bus travel passes, banning students from travelling on buses and/or police prosecution and court action.

If any of your contact details have changed; address, phone number and/or email, please make contact with the office staff to update your information.




All families new to the school, by now, should have received an email outlining how to set up their Parent Portal accounts and a unique access code to link their account to their son.

EXCURSION/CAMP POLICY

This school's policy is informed by the DoE Excursion policy.

Excursions are a valuable part of the school's quality learning. Appropriately planned camps, excursions and incursions greatly assist the students to understand the community in which they live. They provide students with the opportunity to experience different environmental settings and learn new skills from first-hand experience in these settings. They also offer the opportunity for students to interact with their teachers and peers in a setting which is different from the classroom.

PARTICIPATION:

Excursions and camps are inclusive, and all students within the specific learning group are given the opportunity to participate.

Note:

- 1. Only children who have displayed sensible, reliable behaviour at school will be invited to participate in school excursions and camps. If students have displayed unsafe behaviours at school that have resulted in suspension, their attendance of an excursion will be assessed due to their risk, through a case by case basis. As a basic standard, students who have had a Short Suspension in the last 3 months will be excluded. Students who have had a Long Suspension in the last 6 months will be excluded.
- 2. Students who have not paid Compulsory Course Costs will also not be permitted to attend School Camps.

IMPLEMENTATION:

- · An excursion or camp is defined as any activity including school representation beyond the school grounds.
- The Head Teacher and Principal/ Deputy Principal and/or the Department of Education must approve all
 excursions.
- All aspects of the Variation to Routine and DoE Excursion Policies must be strictly followed.
- If any payments are involved, costing must be checked with the SAM before the excursion is approved.
- All families will be provided with all excursion details and will be given sufficient time to make payments for excursions.

Completing the Excursion VTR pro-forma will guide the excursion organiser through EHBHS and DoE policy.

Information for parents

The Enrolment of Students in NSW Covernment Schools policy is in place to assist schools to meet their obligations under the *Education Act 1990* - to ensure that every student has a place at their local school. The policy also communicates to staff and the community a transparent enrolment process.

Why was the enrolment policy revised?

Across the state, many communities are changing. Some are growing at rates never seen before. Some schools that used to be able to accept out-of-area enrolments, no longer have the room to do so.

The revised policy is designed to support schools to manage all enrolment applications, encourage greater consistency in decision-making and make sure the enrolment choices are clear for parents.

What are the changes?

The enrolment cap

The enrolment cap is the number of students that can be enrolled at a school based on the school's permanent accommodation. The enrolment cap tells us whether the school may or may not have the capacity to accept non-local enrolments. It is not a target or limit on the number of local enrolments a school can take.

Each school with a local intake area will have a cap set by the department from Term 4 2019. Within the enrolment cap, a number of enrolment places (the buffer) must be kept aside for the likely number of local students who will need to enrol during the year. For this reason, a school will not take non-local students once they reach their buffer, unless there are exceptional circumstances.

100-point residential address check

Parents planning to enrol their child at a school that is near or at its buffer or cap will be asked to complete the 100-point residential address check to confirm they live within the school's designated intake area. This means parents will need to provide documents to verify the child's current address.

So that schools only seek information relevant to the child's enrolment, a list of approved documents for the residential address check is available from the school or the department's website at https://education.nsw.gov.au/policy-library/policies/enrolment-of-students-in-nsw-government-schools.

Selection criteria for non-local enrolment

Sibling enrolments are now clearly prioritised (where possible) and selection criteria for non-local enrolment will not include student ability, performance or achievement.





What has not changed?

Schools will continue to enrol students who live in their local intake area, regardless of the school's cap status.

Enrolment procedures for students accessing particular education settings (for example selective schools, distance education, specialist support classes for students with disability, Intensive English Centres) are not affected by the revised policy.

In schools with available places, there are no changes to enrolment rights of siblings of non-local students. Each enrolment application is considered on its merits, including if siblings currently attend the school. If the school is below capacity, out-of-area applications for siblings of current students will be given enrolment priority.

Schools will continue to provide families with support and advice during the enrolment process, including assessment of exceptional and compelling circumstances particularly for vulnerable students and their families.

Schools will also continue to apply the policy fairly and consistently using transparent and accountable processes when making decisions about enrolment applications. Parents have a right of appeal to determine whether the stated processes have been applied in a procedurally fair manner.

But what do the changes mean for me?

What if my child is already enrolled but we do not live in that school's intake area?

Your child will remain enrolled at the school as the revised policy does not affect students already enrolled in NSW Government schools.

We were in area when my child was enrolled in the school. The department has since changed the school's boundary and our residence is now out of area. I have other children and I want them all to go to the same school. What are my options?

At times it is necessary for the department to make adjustments to a school's local enrolment intake area. This could mean a family with a child/children already enrolled is then outside the local intake area. When this happens, the family will still be able to enrol siblings together at the school, regardless of whether the school is over the buffer or cap.

I already have a child enrolled as an out-of-area student in a NSW Government school. Can I enrol my other children at that school too?

This will depend on the capacity of the school:

- If the school is **not near its buffer**, then siblings should be able to be enrolled at the school. In fact, siblings of students currently enrolled will be prioritised, where possible, over other non-local enrolment applications.
- If the school is nearing its buffer, then the school will
 form a non-local enrolment panel. The panel considers
 non-local enrolment applications when the number of
 non-local applications received exceeds the number of
 places available below the buffer. Again, in this
 instance, siblings of students currently enrolled will be
 prioritised, where possible, over other non-local
 enrolment applications.
- If the school is at capacity, it will not accept non-local enrolment applications unless there are exceptional circumstances.

I have already accepted an offer for my child to attend a school in 2020 that is not my local school. What happens now?

The enrolment will proceed. Non-local enrolments accepted before Term 4 2019 for students starting in 2020 should not be affected.

What is the criteria for enrolment in a school that is not my local school?

Schools that are able to accept non-local enrolment applications establish a non-local enrolment selection panel, if demand exceeds the number of places below the school's buffer.

Schools are required to make the selection criteria available to the school community.

My circumstances are challenging and I think this school is best for my child. We live outside the school's intake area. What should I do?

We understand that not everyone's circumstances are the same, and that there are instances where exceptional and compelling circumstances will need to be considered. If this is the case, you should talk to the principal of your local school.

The School Opal card

The School Opal card gives eligible students free or discounted travel between home and school using metro, train, bus, ferry and light rail services you nominate in your application.

Who can apply?

To be eligible for a School Opal card, students may need to live a minimum distance from their school:

Years K-2 (Infants)

There is no minimum distance.

Years 3-6 (Primary)

More than 1.6km straight line distance or at least 2.3km walking.

Years 7-12 (Secondary)

More than 2.0km straight line distance or at least 2.9km walking.



If you live too close to be eligible for free travel, you may still qualify for a School Term Bus Pass, which offers travel on buses between home and school at a discounted rate for the whole school term.

Who needs to apply

A new application is only required if the student has not had a School Opal card before.

If the student already has a School Opal card and is changing schools, campuses or home address, you will need to update their Opal card for the new school year before mid-December at apps.transport.nsw.gov.au/ssts

How to apply

Applications for next year open at the start of Term 4 this year.

Step 1

Once the new school has confirmed your child's enrolment, complete the application at apps.transport.nsw.gov.au/ssts

Step 2

The school endorses your application.

Step 3

Once Transport for NSW has approved the application, a School Opal card will be sent to the address provided on the application.



A parent or guardian must apply for students 15 years and under. Students 16 years and over can apply for themselves.



Better together

The School Opal card is only for travel to and from school. So it's a good idea to get a Child/Youth Opal card for travel after hours, on weekends or during school holidays.

Child/Youth Opal card benefits

- · Concession fares across the Opal network
- Half-price travel after eight paid journeys each week*
- \$1 transfer discount for every transfer between modes (metro/train, ferry, bus or light rail) as part of one journey within 60 minutes from the last tap off[†]
- Set auto top up and link it to your credit or debit card so there's always enough value on the card to travel.

ATTENDANCE AT SCHOOL

Why is regular school attendance important?

Regular school attendance will help your child succeed later in life. Attending school every day makes learning easier for your child and helps children build and maintain friendships with other children. If your child doesn't learn the basic skills in the early years of school, they may develop learning problems in later years.

Why is arriving at school on time important?

Arriving at school on time:

- Ensures that your child doesn't miss out on the important learning activities scheduled early in the day when they are most alert.
- Helps your child to learn the important of punctuality and routine.
- Gives your child time to greet their friends before class and therefore reduces the opportunity for classroom disruption.

Lateness is recorded as a partial absence and must be explained to the school the same way as other forms or absence.

When is being away OK?

Sometimes it's hard to decide when it is acceptable to keep your child home from school. Below is a list of acceptable and unacceptable examples:

Acceptable

Unavoidable medical, specialist or dental appointments (Try to encourage appointments outside school hours, or close to home time.)
Urgent family situation (E.g. funerals)
Sick or infectious disease (E.g. conjunctivitis)

Unacceptable

Shopping Sleeping in

Working around the house

Minding siblings/other children/older relatives

Minor family events (birthdays)

Hair cuts

Weather conditions: Rainy/Windy/Hot

Frequent car problems Frequent late train/bus

Airport/Visitors from overseas or other states

Other member of the family is sick Hospital Visits to relatives or friends

Head Lice (This can be treated effectively at

home after school)

IMPORTANT INFORMATION

When picking up your son/s at the end of the day please be mindful of the laws around pickups and parking in Lucas Rd. Also, as a courtesy to our neighbours we ask that you follow all instructions from staff. This means not parking/waiting for your son/s in designated bus zones, not turning in inappropriate locations which hold up traffic, and not waiting in traffic in the middle of the road for your son.

It is very important that you consider everyone in the community, not just your own needs. By following these rules and guidelines it will help us clear the streets quicker, serve the bus company easier and help all students get home safely.

I have been in contact with Bankstown Council and starting from next week they will be sending Rangers out to fine individuals who are breaking the law.

The legalities of compulsory school attendance

In Australia, regular school attendance is compulsory between the ages of 6-17. Children of compulsory school age MUST attend school every day that school is open for instruction


It is important to understand that the New South Wales Department of Education may prosecute parents (including carers) if children of compulsory school age have recurring numbers of unjustified absences from school.

How can you help promote regular attendance of your child?

- Send your child to school as much as possible.
- Getting to school on time is really important. The first 20 minutes of class is where children learn important skills and get used to routine. Also, being late can make a child feel behind and left out for the rest of the day.
- If your child has been absent, please send a note to explain this absence within 7 days.
- Be organised. It's not always easy when your child springs the permission slip on you on the morning it's due, but a good way to avoid problems like this is to ask your child to show you any notes or homework when they get home from school. You may also need to check their bags yourself!
- Sports carnivals, excursions and other special event days are just the same as regular school days. Attendance is compulsory.

Notes! Notes! Notes!



- **Absentee notes:** If your child is sick, or there is a family emergency, we need to know. This year, the school is issuing booklets of simple, tear out absentee notes that make it easier for you to send a note to school with your child. Please ask at the office if you don't receive one.
- Late notes: Life happens, especially in the morning for some reason! If your child is late for school, please send a short note in with them. Make sure they know to give this to their teacher.
- **Time limits:** Lots of parents don't realise that schools are only able to accept absentee notes within a certain time frame. Legally, the school can only accept notes explaining an absence <u>within 7 days</u> of that absence occurring. After this time frame elapses, the absence must be marked as unexplained.



Take your holidays when we do!



School is an important time in your child's life, where they learn social and academic skills and the routines and work ethic that will stay with them throughout their life. But because children need time to be children, there are also school holidays which allow them time off from the formalities of school. Students in NSW have a total of approximately 12 weeks off school each year. The school holidays for 2021 are as follows:

Term 1 Holidays: 5th April – 16th April 2021 Term 2 Holidays: 28th June – 9th July 2021

Term 3 Holidays: 20th September – 1st October 2021

Term 4 Holidays: 20th December – 27th January 2022

Family holidays are an important part of growing up, but so is attending school. For this reason, we ask that wherever possible, you take your holidays when we do, during school holiday time. Even taking a couple of weeks off school during term time can make it very hard for your child to catch up on their work and if this is repeated over several years, children often find themselves falling behind.

If you must schedule your holiday during term time, we ask that you please do the following things before you go:

- Complete travel request forms, which can be collected from our front office.
- Provide additional documentation, such as travel itineraries. If you do not notify the school, your child's absences will be marked down as unexplained.

Attendance is recorded each day. As a parent or caregiver you are responsible for ensuring your child attends school every day, including sports days unless your child:

- has an unavoidable medical or dental appointment (preferably these should be made after school or during holidays)
- is required to attend a recognised religious holiday
- is required to attend an exceptional or urgent family circumstance (such as attending a funeral)
- is sick, or has an infectious illness.

Students need to attend school regularly to meet the course requirements of the Higher School Certificate.

If you are having difficulty getting your child to attend school regularly, you might like to talk to the school principal or the school counsellor.

If your child has to be absent from school for any reason, including arriving late or leaving early, please either tell your child's teacher or the administration assistant at our school, or explain the reason by phone, email, or written note as soon as possible and within seven days.

The school uses automated SMS to inform parents of any unexplained absences or unexplained late arrivals. You can reply to this SMS with the reason for your son's absence so our system can be updated accordingly. Please reply with a valid reason eg. – sick, religious holiday, etc. Replying with a "Yes" does not validate your son's absence and further correspondence will be sent.

Medical Certificates



Principals are legally responsible for keeping accurate records of student attendance. Principals are also responsible for deciding if the reason given for an absence is justified. For this reason, Principals may request medical certificates or other documentation for long or frequent absences explained by parents as being due to illness. If Principals don't consider an explanation to be satisfactory, they will record the absence as unjustified.

There is no place for bullies at East Hills Boys High School. Bullying behaviours will not be tolerated and they include:

- 1. Verbal and Visual Bullying: Teasing, name calling, offensive language, notes, graffiti, email, text messages, phone calls.
- 2. Physical Bullying: Pushing, tripping, punching, hitting, slapping.
- 3. Exclusion: Ignoring, isolating a person
- 4. Victimisation: Ganging up, threats, spreading rumours, whispering.
- 5. Emotional Abuse: Personal or family insults, threatening to withdraw friendship, isolation.
- 6. Extortion: Stand-over tactics, demanding money or goods, damaging or stealing other's possessions.
- 7. Racial or Sexual Abuse: Attacks or discrimination because of their race or gender.

No one has to tolerate this – you don't have to!

If you feel that you are being bullied, if you feel that you are experiencing any of the behaviours listed above, or if you see them occurring, see a staff member immediately. Every instance of bullying is followed up.

What to do if YOU are being bullied by any person at school:

- 1. If you can, walk away, ignore the bully and try not to show how upset you are.
- 2. If you can, state quite clearly that you don't like the behaviour, that it is unwelcome and offensive.
- 3. Complete a bullying referral form. (You can find these on the school website) One has been provided below


CHANGE OF POLICY
