Principal's Message

As the school settles into the new school year, I have been really impressed with the ability of our students to engage with their lessons and behave appropriately whilst at school. My thanks to all parents and caregivers who have played a significant role in settling your sons and encouraging them to participate in their learning. As we work together as a team, we are better equipped to cater to your sons' needs.

Whilst the behaviour of the boys at school has been exemplary overall, we still have concerns about their behaviour in the community, especially when traversing to and from home. This may be on the buses, trains or walking home. Please remind them that they are not only representatives of the school whilst they are on their way home but they are also representatives of their families. Respectful behaviour is essential at all times and this message needs to be delivered by the school and parents.

I was extremely pleased with the turnout to our 2022 Open Night on Monday 14 March. It was great to see so many prospective families engaging with the school and coming in to see what facilities we have at East Hills Boys. We know that we are a great school with outstanding academic, sporting and cultural results and it was wonderful to see our community of Year 6 students doing their homework and exploring what we have to offer. Our numbers have been steadily rising over the past couple of years and this is exemplified by our 172 students we have enrolled in Year 7 2022. With the huge numbers that attended Open Night on Monday, I am very confident that 2023 will see another significant increase in students attending East Hills Boys High School. What has been particularly impressive with the increase, has been the number of In-Area students returning to our school. This years Year 7 sees 36% of our students from within our local community, which was up from 25% in 2021. Hopefully that number also continues to rise.

I would like to extend the best wishes of the school to those families that have had to deal with the flooding phenomenon of the past few weeks. There have been families who have been severely affected by the floods and to those families we wish a speedy recovery for your family.

With the rains hopefully in our rear vision mirror we can get back to some our special interest groups that we were developing before the rains came. I know that the SEF garden club are keen to get back into their routines and work through maintaining and establishing new gardens around the school. The Construction boys can now make full use of their new facilities in "The Compound" and with the cricket nets now finished the boys in the cricket program with Mr Hackshall and Mr Williams can get out there and use their new equipment including the new bowling machine. Many of the staff are also keen to face the bowling machine!!!

Many of our other infrastructural improvements will also be ready over the coming weeks. The new walkways will be finished off before the end of term and the refurbishment of the basketball courts will also he completed in the same timeframe. During the Easter holidays we will be looking at starting our new

outdoor classroom room facility. Which will be located at the front of the Café and will provide an area for
outdoor learning and relaxation during break times.

Every moment counts during heart failure and by having this lifesaving equipment close to hand could potentially save lives.





Literacy & numeracy program:

Parents – Here are some of the current issues in literacy and numeracy. They are all important in your son's schooling!

Year 7 students:

Parents, please encourage your son to read at home, whenever possible, and in addition to his subject-based homework. At least 20 minutes per evening is recommended. The school's Accelerated Reader program has commenced, and the at-home reading can focus on readers which are part of this program. Readers can be borrowed from the school library, or are available online.



Year 8 students:

In Weeks 9 & 10 of this Term, all Year 8 students will participate in <u>Check-in reading and numeracy online</u> <u>tests</u>. These tests help the school to diagnose areas of weakness. They do not produce reports to parents, but progress information can be provided to parents, on request.

Year 7 & 9 students:

As advised in the last newsletter, Year 7 & 9 students are being prepared for the upcoming NAPLAN tests $(10^{th} - 20^{th} \text{ May})$. This year, in all schools, <u>all NAPLAN tests will be on-line</u>, so it is important that students are ready (a letter is being sent to all Year 7 and 9 parents about this). **Year 9 students should be especially diligent in completing the weekly Google Classroom literacy/numeracy homework, in preparation.**

Year 10 students:

Again, as already advised, the NSW Educational Standards Authority (NESA) has stated that, from now on, students need to <u>achieve minimum literacy and numeracy standards</u> in order to gain an HSC. In Week 8 of this Term, all Year 10 students will have completed three on-line tests (in reading, writing and numeracy), in order to demonstrate these standards. A letter was sent to all Year 10 parents, early this year, providing more details.

Further test opportunities and support, each Term, will be available to students who are unsuccessful in achieving one or more of these Minimum Standards.


Year 11/12 students:

Minimum Standards tests are also being conducted, each Term, for Year 11 & 12 students who have yet to demonstrate those standards. If uncertain about the status of your son with respect to Minimum Standards, please do not hesitate to contact Mr Bawden (Tuesdays and Thursdays), at the school. Contact details are listed below.

All students:

Homework Help runs each week, on <u>Wednesdays and Thursdays</u>, after school for one hour in the library. Assistance, especially in literacy, is available at these times. Make use of this valuable time!

School student travel information for parents and students

School Travel Passes

Students who need a School Opal card or travel pass but have not yet applied need to apply or update their details as soon as possible.

In the Opal network, students should travel with a Child/Youth Opal card until they receive their valid School Opal card. If outside Greater Sydney, parents should contact their <u>local</u> bus operator to discuss their travel needs.

New Student Opal cards (including new Term Bus Passes) will be sent to the student's nominated postal address within two weeks of their application being approved.

Students living in rural and regional (R&R) areas will receive their travel pass from their nominated transport operator. It may be issued via their school or be sent directly to them at home. **Note**: some R&R operators do not issue travel passes. Students/parents should confirm with their nominated operator if they do not receive a pass.

Terms of Use

Students using Opal cards must tap on and tap off in line with the Opal terms of use.

All students are required to comply with the <u>Student code of conduct</u>. The code of conduct aims to ensure the safety and well-being of school children and other passengers. It is important that parents ensure their child is aware of this, as failure to comply with the code of conduct can result in a suspension from travel.




Any parents experiencing difficulty either setting up or accessing the portal should contact the school for assistance.





The School Opal card

The School Opal card gives eligible students free or discounted travel between home and school using metro, train, bus, ferry and light rail services you nominate in your application.

Who can apply?

To be eligible for a School Opal card, students may need to live a minimum distance from their school:

Years K-2 (Infants)

There is no minimum distance.

Years 3-6 (Primary)

More than 1.6km straight line distance or at least 2.3km walking.

Years 7-12 (Secondary)

More than 2.0km straight line distance or at least 2.9km walking.



If you live too close to be eligible for free travel, you may still qualify for a School Term Bus Pass, which offers travel on buses between home and school at a discounted rate for the whole school term.

Who needs to apply

A new application is only required if the student has not had a School Opal card before.

If the student already has a School Opal card and is changing schools, campuses or home address, you will need to update their Opal card for the new school year before mid-December at apps.transport.nsw.gov.au/ssts

How to apply

Applications for next year open at the start of Term 4 this year.

Step 1

Once the new school has confirmed your child's enrolment, complete the application at apps.transport.nsw.gov.au/ssts

Step 2

The school endorses your application.

Step 3

Once Transport for NSW has approved the application, a School Opal card will be sent to the address provided on the application.



A parent or guardian must apply for students 15 years and under. Students 16 years and over can apply for themselves.



Better together

The School Opal card is only for travel to and from school. So it's a good idea to get a Child/Youth Opal card for travel after hours, on weekends or during school holidays.

Child/Youth Opal card benefits

- · Concession fares across the Opal network
- Half-price travel after eight paid journeys each week*
- \$1 transfer discount for every transfer between modes (metro/train, ferry, bus or light rail) as part of one journey within 60 minutes from the last tap off†
- Set auto top up and link it to your credit or debit card so there's always enough value on the card to travel.

When picking up your son/s at the end of the day please be mindful of the laws around pickups and parking in Lucas Rd. Also, as a courtesy to our neighbours we ask that you follow all instructions from staff. This means not parking/waiting for your son/s in designated bus zones, not turning in inappropriate locations which hold up traffic, and not waiting in traffic in the middle of the road for your son.



Take your holidays when we do!



School is an important time in your child's life, where they learn social and academic skills and the routines and work ethic that will stay with them throughout their life. But because children need time to be children, there are also school holidays which allow them time off from the formalities of school. Students in NSW have a total of approximately 12 weeks off school each year. The school holidays for 2022 are as follows:

Term 1 Holidays: 11th April – 22nd April 2022

Term 2 Holidays: 4th July – 15th July 2022

Term 3 Holidays: 26th September – 7th October 2022

Term 4 Holidays: 21st December – 26th January 2023

Family holidays are an important part of growing up, but so is attending school. For this reason, we ask that wherever possible, you take your holidays when we do, during school holiday time. Even taking a couple of weeks off school during term time can make it very hard for your child to catch up on their work and if this is repeated over several years, children often find themselves falling behind.

If you must schedule your holiday during term time, we ask that you please do the following things before you go:

- Complete travel request forms, which can be collected from our front office.
- Provide additional documentation, such as travel itineraries. If you do not notify the school, your child's absences will be marked down as unexplained.

Attendance is recorded each day. As a parent or caregiver you are responsible for ensuring your child attends school every day, including sports days unless your child:

- has an unavoidable medical or dental appointment (preferably these should be made after school or during holidays)
- is required to attend a recognised religious holiday
- is required to attend an exceptional or urgent family circumstance (such as attending a funeral)
- is sick, or has an infectious illness.

Students need to attend school regularly to meet the course requirements of the Higher School Certificate.

If you are having difficulty getting your child to attend school regularly, you might like to talk to the school principal or the school counsellor.

If your child has to be absent from school for any reason, including arriving late or leaving early, please either tell your child's teacher or the administration assistant at our school, or explain the reason by phone, email, or written note as soon as possible and within seven days.

The school uses automated SMS to inform parents of any unexplained absences or unexplained late arrivals. You can reply to this SMS with the reason for your son's absence so our system can be updated accordingly. Please reply with a valid reason eg. – sick, religious holiday, etc. Replying with a "Yes" does not validate your son's absence and further correspondence will be sent.

Medical Certificates



Principals are legally responsible for keeping accurate records of student attendance. Principals are also responsible for deciding if the reason given for an absence is justified. For this reason, Principals may request medical certificates or other documentation for long or frequent absences explained by parents as being due to illness. If Principals don't consider an explanation to be satisfactory, they will record the absence as unjustified.

There is no place for bullies at East Hills Boys High School. Bullying behaviours will not be tolerated and they include:


- 1. Verbal and Visual Bullying: Teasing, name calling, offensive language, notes, graffiti, email, text messages, phone calls.
- 2. Physical Bullying: Pushing, tripping, punching, hitting, slapping.
- 3. Exclusion: Ignoring, isolating a person
- 4. Victimisation: Ganging up, threats, spreading rumours, whispering.
- 5. Emotional Abuse: Personal or family insults, threatening to withdraw friendship, isolation.
- 6. Extortion: Stand-over tactics, demanding money or goods, damaging or stealing other's possessions.
- 7. Racial or Sexual Abuse: Attacks or discrimination because of their race or gender.

No one has to tolerate this - you don't have to!

If you feel that you are being bullied, if you feel that you are experiencing any of the behaviours listed above, or if you see them occurring, see a staff member immediately. Every instance of bullying is followed up.

What to do if YOU are being bullied by any person at school:

- 1. If you can, walk away, ignore the bully and try not to show how upset you are.
- 2. If you can, state quite clearly that you don't like the behaviour, that it is unwelcome and offensive.
- 3. Complete a bullying referral form. (You can find these on the school website) One has been provided below


The procedure for taking students out of school during school hours is as follows:
