Make a Mate





Universal Robotics Challenge 2023














Year 8 – Students have been exploring cars in art for their unit 'REVVED UP' and created a detailed car design based on a section of their chosen vehicle.



Literacy & Numeracy Program

Parents -

The end of another year may be a good time to reflect on your son's confidence in his literacy and numeracy skills! There are so many ways, these days, that we get feedback about these, and chances to correct weaknesses.

Year 7, 8 & 9 students:

I mentioned in the last newsletter that all Year 7, 8 & 9 students would this Term be participating in **reading and numeracy check-in online assessments**, and these have now concluded. These assessments do not provide parent reports, but they are a valuable source of information for the school, and results are now available to parents who request them. Please just send me an email, via the school email address, if you would like an updated reading or numeracy report on your son.

Year 8 students:

This is a reminder, too, for Year 8 students and parents, that **NAPLAN online tests** will be held next Term from 15th to 27th March – much earlier in the year than normal.

All Year 8 students have been practising reading, numeracy and language exercises on Google Classroom for the past two Terms. These are still all available, and now is a good time to revise them.

Year 10 & 11 students:

As always, I remind parents that achievement of **Minimum Standards in reading, writing and numeracy** remains a requirement for the award of the Higher School Certificate. For students in Years 10 and 11 who still need to achieve one or more Minimum Standards, most testing has now finished for the year. Further opportunities will be available in Term 1, next year.




Writing support:

I make special mention of writing in this edition.

Of all the literacy and numeracy skill-areas, writing presents the greatest challenge to the greatest number of students. So, through the *whole-school writing strategy*, as well as through NAPLAN results, writing skills are carefully monitored.

From this data, a number of students are selected for extra writing support, which includes the chance to take part in small-group workshops. Here, the *rules of writing* are practised, along *with brainstorming of ideas*.





The school's aim is to develop students' confidence and skills in extended writing – something which will stand them in good stead for the rest of their lives.





IMPORTANT INFORMATION

When picking up your son/s at the end of the day please be mindful of the laws around pickups and parking in Lucas Rd. Take your holidays when we do!



School is an important time in your child's life, where they learn social and academic skills and the routines and work ethic that will stay with them throughout their life. But because children need time to be children, there are also school holidays which allow them time off from the formalities of school. Students in NSW have a total of approximately 12 weeks off school each year. The school holidays for 2022 are as follows:

Term 1 Holidays: 10th April – 21st April 2023

Term 2 Holidays: 3rd July – 14th July 2023

Term 3 Holidays: 25th September – 6th October 2023

Term 4 Holidays: 20th December – 29th January 2024

Family holidays are an important part of growing up, but so is attending school. For this reason, we ask that wherever possible, you take your holidays when we do, during school holiday time. Even taking a couple of weeks off school during term time can make it very hard for your child to catch up on their work and if this is repeated over several years, children often find themselves falling behind.

If you must schedule your holiday during term time, we ask that you please do the following things before you go:

- Complete travel request forms, which can be collected from our front office.
- Provide additional documentation, such as travel itineraries. If you do not notify the school, your child's absences will be marked down as unexplained.

Attendance is recorded each day. As a parent or caregiver you are responsible for ensuring your child attends school every day, including sports days unless your child:

- has an unavoidable medical or dental appointment (preferably these should be made after school or during holidays)
- is required to attend a recognised religious holiday
- is required to attend an exceptional or urgent family circumstance (such as attending a funeral)
- is sick, or has an infectious illness.

Students need to attend school regularly to meet the course requirements of the Higher School Certificate.

If you are having difficulty getting your child to attend school regularly, you might like to talk to the school principal or the school counsellor.

If your child has to be absent from school for any reason, including arriving late or leaving early, please either tell your child's teacher or the administration assistant at our school, or explain the reason by phone, email, or written note as soon as possible and within seven days.

The school uses automated SMS to inform parents of any unexplained absences or unexplained late arrivals. You can reply to this SMS with the reason for your son's absence so our system can be updated accordingly. Please reply with a valid reason eg. – sick, religious holiday, etc. Replying with a "Yes" does not validate your son's absence and further correspondence will be sent.

Medical Certificates



Principals are legally responsible for keeping accurate records of student attendance. Principals are also responsible for deciding if the reason given for an absence is justified. For this reason, Principals may request medical certificates or other documentation for long or frequent absences explained by parents as being due to illness. If Principals don't consider an explanation to be satisfactory, they will record the absence as unjustifie

There is no place for bullies at East Hills Boys High School. Bullying behaviours will not be tolerated and they include:

- 1. Verbal and Visual Bullying: Teasing, name calling, offensive language, notes, graffiti, email, text messages, phone calls.
- 2. Physical Bullying: Pushing, tripping, punching, hitting, slapping.
- 3. Exclusion: Ignoring, isolating a person
- 4. Victimisation: Ganging up, threats, spreading rumours, whispering.
- 5. Emotional Abuse: Personal or family insults, threatening to withdraw friendship, isolation.
- 6. Extortion: Stand-over tactics, demanding money or goods, damaging or stealing other's possessions.
- 7. Racial or Sexual Abuse: Attacks or discrimination because of their race organder.

No one has to tolerate this – you don't have to!

If you feel that you are being bullied, if you feel that you are experiencing any of the behaviours listed above, or if you see them occurring, see a staff member immediately. Every instance of bullying is followed up.

What to do if YOU are being bullied by any person at school:

- 1. If you can, walk away, ignore the bully and try not to show how upset you are.
- 2. If you can, state quite clearly that you don't like the behaviour, that it is unwelcome and offensive.
- 3. Complete a bullying referral form. (You can find these on the school website) One has been provided below

STUDENTS LEAVING SCHOOL EARLY


The procedure for taking students out of school during school hours is as follows:
